

It is called Holy Discontent. It is when your children and grandchildren don't go to church and you feel like you should do something about it, but don't know what. It is when you know that there are an increasing number of poor and homeless people in our community and you want to make a difference. It is when you think that there must be something that can be done about the drug epidemic, but you feel totally out of your league.

Holy Discontent happens when God breaks our hearts for others. It is when the Holy Spirit gets ahold of our hearts and convinces us that there is work to be done and won't leave us alone until we act. Over the years the people of this church have experienced Holy Discontent many times and have responded. But not every time. We all have good reasons for not launching into action. We are too old, or too sick, or too busy. We convince ourselves that maybe the bigger churches should take on those kinds of problems.

The reality is that when we find our hearts totally touched by a situation, God is calling us to do something. It is part of the way God motivates us.


