 Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts up to the Holy Thursday Evening.




# From the Lay Leader March 2019 "The Fisherman"

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" or "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."

The ashes on our forehead remind us of the Lenten call for penance and conversion.
