



Faith's Mission of helping Haywood Pathways provide some food to its residents is a work in progress. With the backing of Mission Chair Beth, financial help from Faith and anonymous donors, a tower was delivered.

In early October, WNC Urban Farms assembled the aeroponic growing tower at Pathways. Because the growing season was just about gone, they offered at no charge the use of grow lights until the tower can be located outside since the tower was placed in the pantry at Pathways.

Pathways Executive Director Mandy Haithcox shared with me recently that they should be harvesting various herbs and lettuce types very soon. She said that she'd never seen plants growing in a pantry and the plants make the air seem very fresh and clean. The residents who have seen the tower think it's "cool" and are interested in watching the plants grow. Mandy thinks that when the tower can be placed outside, more of the residents will take an interest in it.

The picture below was taken the day the tower was set up. Pam Haralson is the farm person who helped assemble the tower.
